Health Policies

- State regulations require us to maintain a current record of immunizations for each child enrolled. Your child may not attend school without a record of current and up-to-date immunizations on file.
- A temperature of 100 degrees or over, discolored mucus in the nose, persistent coughing, diarrhea, or vomiting, are all reasons for a child not to be in school. If your child develops any symptoms of illness at school, you or your emergency contact will be called to take your child home immediately. Your child should be fever-free without medication, for a full 24 hours before returning to school. Do not send your child to school within 24 hours of vomiting or diarrhea. Do not send your child to school when they are not well enough to participate in the classroom and outdoor activities. If your child is too sick to go outside for recess, they are too sick to be brought to school.
- For the protection of all children in our care, a child should be kept at home (and we will not accept them at school) if the following symptoms are displayed:
 - Elevated temperature (over 100 degrees without any fever-reducing medication)
 - Vomiting
 - Diarrhea
 - Stomach ache
 - Skin rash
 - Sore throat
 - Earache/discharge
 - Red/discharging eyes
- Communicable diseases that exclude a child from attending school:
 - Chickenpox
 - Rubella (German measles)
 - Haemophilus influenzae (Hib)
 - Scabies
 - Mumps
 - Measles
 - Meningococcal disease
 - Strep throat
 - Tuberculosis (TB)

- Whooping cough (pertussis)
- Giardia infection (giardiasis)
- Hepatitis A
- Salmonellosis
- Shigella infection (shigellosis)
- Impetigo
- Head Lice/Nits
- Ringworm (tinea)
- Pinworm infection
- Children excluded from school because of suspicion or actual disease requiring isolation may be re-admitted when
 a physician certifies that they are no longer suffering from such a disease. Some diseases need to be reported to
 the Arkansas Department of Health and Human Services. These include, but are not restricted to, Hepatitis,
 Measles, Rubella, Whooping Cough, Meningitis, Shigellosis, Tuberculosis, and Mumps.
- If your child needs to take medication during the school day, a medication chart must be completed and signed. All
 medications must be in their original container, showing the type of medication and the dose. We will not accept
 telephone authorizations for administration of medication. Medication should be handed to a member of staff, not
 sent in the child's lunch box/backpack, etc.
- Please contact the school by 9:00 AM if your child will not be attending school due to illness. Please notify us promptly if your child has a suspected or confirmed communicable illness so we may monitor the other children who may have been exposed.
- Provide one container of insect repellant and one container of sunblock, labeled with your child's name, at the beginning of each school year.
- Injury reports will be completed on injuries which require first aid treatment (e.g., scrap/cut resulting in leaking blood, bump requiring the use of an ice pack.)
- Injury reports will also be completed on all bites that leave a mark. The parents of the children involved are informed of the incident. When older children bite intentionally, the disciplinary guidelines are followed.
